Our Supply Chain

CrisisCast seeks to establish relationships with suppliers, contractors and partners that are based on trust, professionalism and ethical business practices.

Due to the nature and scale of our business, we assess the overall risk of modern slavery within our direct operations and supply chain to be relatively low. Our supply chain is primarily UK-based and consists mainly of professional services, freelance personnel, venue providers, technical suppliers and production support services.

Organisational Actions

CrisisCast undertakes proportionate steps to support the prevention of modern slavery, including:

- carrying out reasonable due diligence when selecting suppliers and contractors;
- considering supplier reputation and compliance with applicable laws and regulations;
- expecting suppliers and partners to comply with relevant employment, health & safety and equality legislation;
- not knowingly entering into business with any organisation involved in slavery, servitude, forced labour or human trafficking;
- promoting a culture in which concerns can be raised openly and appropriately.




Individual Responsibilities
